City Council Proceedings
June 16, 2026

A regular meeting of the Cody City Council was held in the Council Chambers at City Hall in Cody, Wyoming on Tuesday, June 16, 2026 at 7:00 PM.

Mayor Reiter called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM.

Present: Mayor Reiter, Council Members Tim McIsaac, Kelly Tamblyn, Jeremy Laing, Don F. Shreve Jr., Joanna Settineri and Emily Swett. City Administrator Tony Tolstedt; City Attorney Scott Kolpitzke and Administrative Services Officer Tina Gail.

Absent: None.

Council Member Shreve made a motion seconded by Council Member Settineri to approve the Consent Calendar to include: Approval of Minutes from June 2nd and June 9th, 2026; Approve Vouchers and Payroll in the amount of \$1,623,585.17; Agreement for Encroachment License with Collier, Laura I.U. 2013 Management Trust located at 944 Simpson Avenue; Request from Special Olympics Wyoming – Cody for a street closure of Beck Avenue between 9th and 10th Streets and 10th Street between Beck and Sheridan, allow vendors and tractor show parking on the closed streets, and approve an Open Container and Malt Beverage Permit on August 29, 2026 from 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m.; Request from Wild West Paddle Club for an Open Container and Malt Beverage Permit for the annual Wild West River Fest to be held in City Park on August 8, 2026 from 6:00 p.m. to 10:00 p.m. and approval to close parking stalls on Beck Avenue for food trucks; Request from Park County Search and Rescue for a partial street closure of 15th Street between Salsbury and the alley north of Salsbury on September 12, 2026 from 2:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m.; Approval of the write-off of \$79,442.12 in uncollectible accounts; and authorization for the Mayor, on behalf of the Cody Public Art Committee, to enter into an agreement with the Wyoming Cultural Trust Fund to accept a grant award of \$9,000 for a public art mural installation at the Seidel Saddlery Building contingent upon final review and comments by City Attorney.

Public Comments

Karen Ballinger spoke regarding water concerns located at the Terrace.

At 7:05 p.m. Mayor Reiter entered into a second Public Hearing to consider if it is in the public's interest to approve the Fiscal Year 2026-2027 budget for the City of Cody. Mayor Reiter asked for comments three times and there being none closed the public hearing at 7:11 p.m.

At 7:11 p.m. Mayor Reiter entered into a Public Hearing to consider if it is in the public's

interest to renew 22 retail liquor licenses, 1 Commercial Airport retail license, 12 restaurant liquor licenses, 9 bar and grill liquor licenses, 3 limited (club) retail licenses, and 3 microbrewery permits, for the period of August 1, 2026, through July 31, 2027. Mayor Reiter asked for comments three times and there being none closed the public hearing at 7:13 p.m.

Council Member Tamblyn made a motion seconded by Council Member Swett to approve the renewal of 22 retail liquor licenses, 1 commercial airport retail license, 3 limited retail licenses (clubs), 3 microbrewery permits, 12 restaurant liquor licenses, and 9 bar and grill liquor licenses for the period of August 1, 2026 through July 31, 2027. Vote was unanimous.

Ordinance 2026-09 Third and Final Reading

An Ordinance adopting the annual budget for the City of Cody, Wyoming for the Fiscal Year ending June 30, 2027. Council Member Swett made a motion seconded by Council Member Laing to approve Ordinance 2026-09 on Third and Final Reading. Vote was unanimous.

Ordinance 2026-10 Third and Final Reading

An Ordinance levying taxes for the City of Cody, Wyoming for the Fiscal Year ending June 30, 2027. Council Member Settineri made a motion seconded by Council Member Swett to approve Ordinance 2026-10 on Third and Final Reading. Vote was unanimous.

Ordinance 2026-08 Third and Final Reading

An Ordinance to Amend Title 9, Chapter 3, Section 1 of the City of Cody. Council Member Shreve made a motion seconded by Council Member Tamblyn to approve Ordinance 2026-08 on Third and Final Reading. Vote was unanimous.

Resolution 2026-09

A Resolution approving Budget Amendment No. 3 for the Fiscal Year ending June 30, 2026. Council Member Swett made a motion seconded by Council Member Laing to approve Resolution 2026-09. Vote was unanimous.

Council Member Tamblyn made a motion seconded by Council Member Settineri to approve the Disposal Service Agreement with the Park County Regional Landfill and authorize the Mayor to execute the agreement contingent upon final review and comments by the City Attorney. Vote was unanimous.
